## 2024 Documents to bring to Tax Prep Appointment

## Bring the following documents to your tax prep appointment:

- 1. Government-issued photo ID for each taxpayer
- 2. Social Security card(s) or other official documentation that show the taxpayer identification numbers for every individual on your return
- 3. Previous year's tax return [2023]
- 4. Checking or savings account information if you want to direct deposit any refund(s) or direct debit any amounts due.

#### **Income Documents:**

- 1. W-2 for each employer
- 2. 1099-G for unemployment compensation or state/local income tax refunds
- 3. SSA-1099 showing the total Social Security benefits paid, or RRB-1099, Tier 1 Railroad Retirement benefits form
- 4. 1099 forms reporting interest (1099-INT), dividends (1099-DIV), and/or Brokerage Statements (1099-B)
- 5. 1099-R form if you received a pension, annuity, or IRA distribution
- 6. 1099-MISC, 1099-K, or other 1099 forms
- 7. IRS letter 6419 detailing any Advance Child Tax Credit received

#### Payments:

Federal and/or state and/or local income tax paid (including quarterly estimated tax payments) if not shown on income documents.

## Deductions:

- 1. 1098 showing home mortgage interest
- 2. A summary list of medical/dental/vision expenses including doctor and hospital bills and medical insurance premiums, prescription medicines, assisted living services, long-term insurance and bills for medical related home improvements such as ramps and railing for people with disabilities
- 3. Summary of cash and noncash contributions to charity
- 4. Property tax bills paid during the year (frequently shown on mortgage statement)

# Health Insurance:

1095-A form if you purchased insurance through the Marketplace (Exchange)
